Going forward when conducting audits, inspections, investigations and reviews the OIG will take into consideration approved federal and state statute, waivers and guidance for any dates that fall within the coronavirus public health emergency time period.

During this time the OIG is actively monitoring for potential schemes noted by The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General and the Justice Department related to COVID-19 including false tests and testing locations, vaccines, or other treatments.

The OIG is focused on protecting the health and safety of Texans and will investigate all allegations of fraud, waste, and abuse during this public health crisis and take action as appropriate. Violations of law will be subject to civil or criminal penalties.
